INTRODUCTION

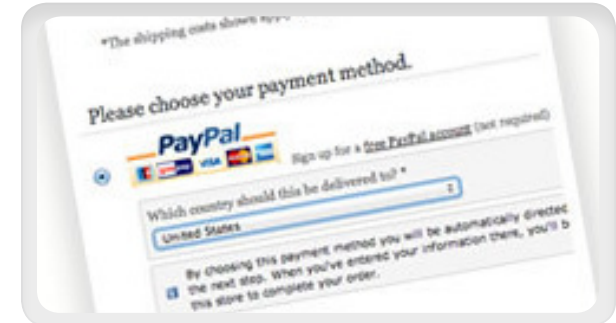
It is easy to use PayPal with Jimdo because Jimdo has integrated PayPal as a default way to accept credit card in your Jimdo store!

These instructions assume you have already created a Jimdo Store. If you have not created a Jimdo Store, see these instructions to set up your store:

To use PayPal as your payment method in your store you need to do two things:

1. Complete your Personal Profile
2. Activate PayPal as your form of payment



1. PERSONAL PROFILE

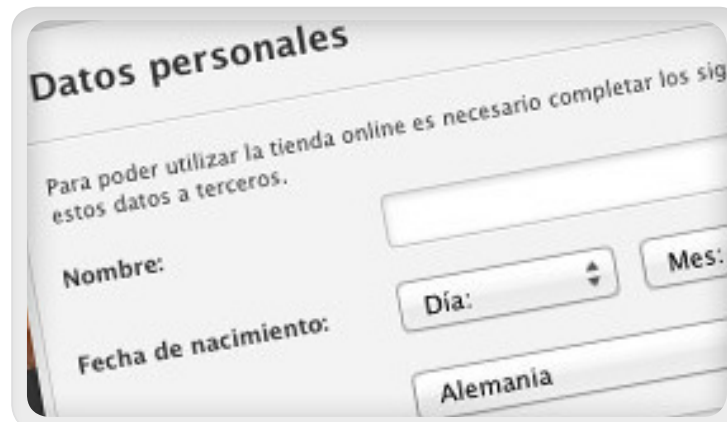
For Security reasons, Jimdo requires you to complete your personal profile to activate your store. Follow these steps to complete your personal profile:

Step 1: Select “**Settings**” in the toolbar.

Step 2: Select “**Personal Profile**” in the “**User**” section.

Step 3: Add your profile information.

Step 4: Click “**Save**”.



2. ACTIVATE PAYPAL AS YOUR FORM OF PAYMENT

Jimdo has PayPal pre-integrated as a payment option for your customers to be able to pay you with their credit cards, debit cards, Bank accounts, or other forms of payment depending on their country.

Follow these steps:

Step 1: Click “Settings” in the toolbar.

Step 2: Click “Payment Options” in the “Store” section.

Step 3: Choose “PayPal”.


Step 4: Add your PayPal API Credentials.

- API Username
- API Password
- API Signature

Now Paypal is active in your Jimdo store!

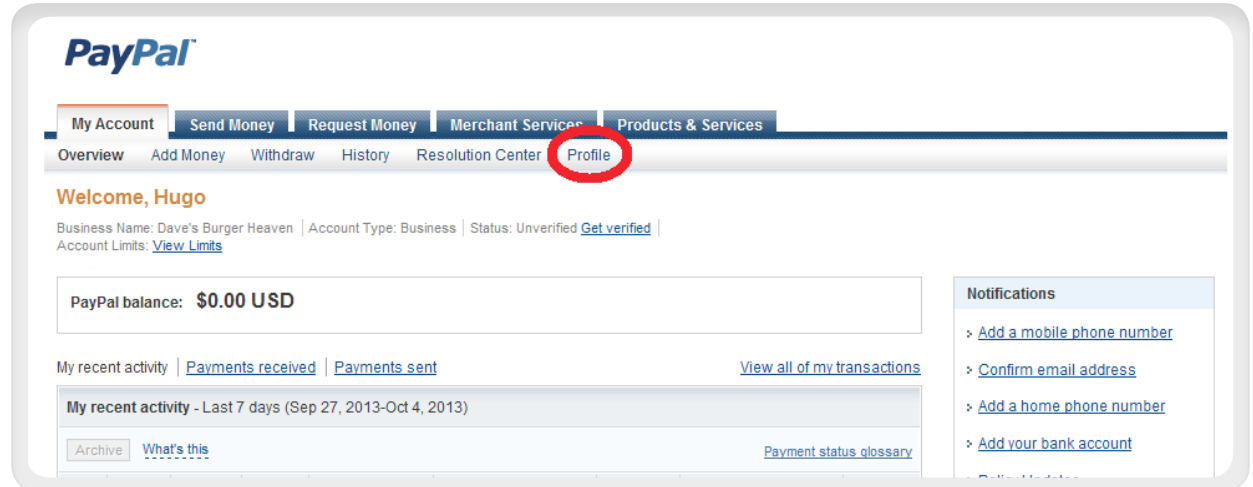

APPENDIX A. HOW TO OBTAIN PAYPAL API CREDENTIALS

Step 1:

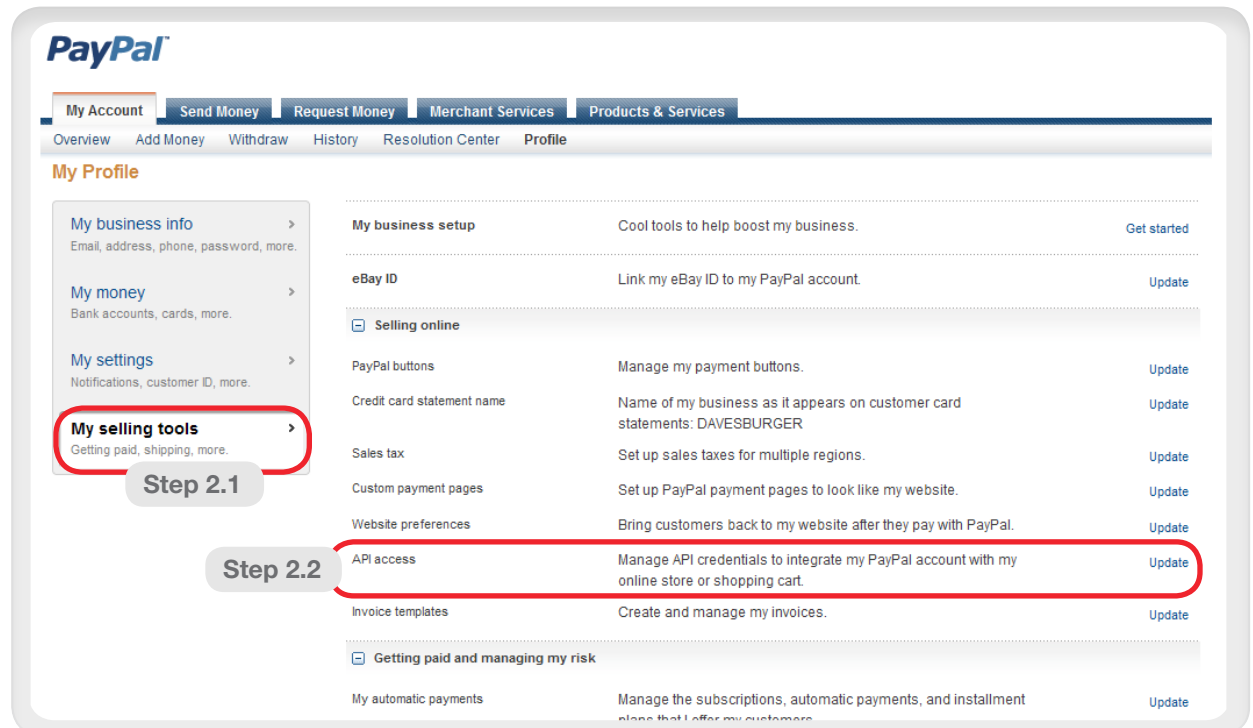
Login to www.paypal.com and click **Profile**.



Step 2: Profile


2.1 Click “My selling tools”.

2.2 In the section “Selling Online”, find “API access” and click “Update”.



Step 3: API Access

On the API Access page, select Option 2: “**Request API credentials**”.

API Access

An API (Application Programming Interface) allows PayPal software to communicate with your online store or shopping cart.

Setting up API permissions and credentials

Choose one of the following options to integrate your PayPal payment solution with your online store or shopping cart.

Option 1 - Grant API permissions to a third party to use certain PayPal APIs on your behalf.

Choose this option if:

- You are using a pre-integrated shopping cart, hosted by a third party
- Your website is hosted and managed by a third-party service provider

Option 2 - Request API credentials to create your own API username and password.

This option applies to:

- Custom websites and online stores
- Pre-integrated shopping carts running on your own server

Accept payments from your online stores before setting up APIs

[Enable Express Checkout](#) to accept payments from your online stores right away. You can set up API permissions or credentials later.

- API Password
- API Signature

For preconfigured shopping carts: Copy and paste the API username, password, and signature into your shopping cart configuration or administration screen.

For building custom shopping carts: Store the following credential information in a secure location with limited access.
